Principal Message

Australian Curriculum Version 9

An updated Prep to Year 10 Australian Curriculum, Version 9, was approved by Education Ministers in early April and is now available on a new website to view.

It is important to remember that the review of the Australian Curriculum was to refine, realign and declutter the content to identify the essential content that our students should learn. During public consultation last year, the department drew heavily on the experience of Queensland teachers and curriculum leaders gained over the past 10 years of implementation.

We have come a long way since 2012 when we first began providing the Australian Curriculum. This updated version offers

us the opportunity to reflect on and review our educational performance. Allowing us to focus on 'what' to teach and 'how' we are going to teach the curriculum.

The most significant change though is the reduction in content, especially for primary teachers who teach a number of learning areas. There is improvement in the quality of content and the achievement standards, a rationalising of the elaborations and authentic alignment to the general capabilities and cross-curriculum priorities.

There is a stronger focus on phonics in English and on mastering essential mathematical facts, concepts, skills and processes. Students will be introduced to concepts and processes at the right time. History has been significantly decluttered, allowing more time for in-depth teaching. There is a strengthening of teaching of consent and respectful relationships in ways that are age appropriate.

A decision regarding when Queensland will transition to Version 9 of the curriculum will be made, in consultation with all school sectors and key stakeholders, over the coming months.

Throughout the year, we will communicate regularly with you and let you know when resources are available to support familiarisation activities and when it is time to provide the updated Australian Curriculum.

On the 4th of May the ARD Mr Tony Roberts and school principals from our area visited to see the great work happening at Tewantin State School. The focus for the visit was on Learning Walls, Deconstructed Learning Intentions and Bump It Up Walls. The visitors entered 6 classrooms, observed the walls and interactions of students, and asked students questions using Sharratt's 5 Questions techniques: What are you learning? Why? How are you going? How do you know? How can you improve? Where do you go for help?

I would like to thank the teachers and staff who assisted with the visit from the ARD. The visitors were very appreciative and impressed with the school culture and the learning and teaching taking place in our school.


